Waste Management - Roger Morrell advised that Hazardous Waste Day is scheduled in Central Manitoulin on July 20th between 1 and 4 p.m. A new textile bin will be installed at the Transfer Station to receive clothing, bedding, shoes, purses, stuffed animals, etc. Things in good condition will be reused. Everything else will be turned into insulation. The recycler at the Transfer Station has not been in operation. There is not enough volume of organic waste to keep it running. Reeve Noland is to check with Billings and NEMI to see if they would be interested in the Recycler.

Manor – Art Hayden advised the Manor is at capacity. The financials are in good condition. The opening of the Courtyard is to occur June 22 at 1 p.m. Everyone is welcome to attend.
